Caregiver Story: My mother and father were engaged and married within 3 months of meeting each other. They were married for over 60 years. They could not remember a time without each other and never spent a night apart. But my mother lost my father this past November from a stroke. She lost the love of her life, her best friend, and her caregiver in less than a week. It was a shock to all of us in the family, and we were not prepared. My father had been taking care of my mom for a number of years now, which seemed appropriate because she had taken care of him for most of his life too. My mother, though, now needs extra care because she has terrible arthritis and had a failed hip replacement surgery. Because of these issues, she has constant pain and great difficulty walking. This pain limits her mobility to the point of only leaving her chair in the living room a few times a day. She cannot bathe without help or prepare herself a hot meal. She is homebound and does not even go outside without someone home for fear of falling. My brother was able to move in with my mother, but he works full-time and sometimes 12-hour days, outside of the house about an hour away. I also live about 45 minutes away and have a family and commitments of my own. But my mother does not want to leave the home she has lived in for over 50 years. However, it is not safe for her to be

alone for 8 to 12 hours a day. When Respite Volunteers of Shiawassee was recommended to us, it was a blessing! Right away, they connected my mom with a Respite volunteer who had similar interests and likes. They got along right away, and now they play games, do puzzles, drink coffee, and chat like long-lost friends, which they are now. These visits give my mom something to look forward to every week and put a smile on my mom's face, which was a hard thing to do after the loss of my dad. Just this alone has helped my mom so much, but Respite Volunteers has done so much more for our family. Our Case Manager at Respite Volunteers has been wonderful. She has helped my mom (who is hard of hearing) navigate the paperwork for other organizations that she can qualify for help from. She helped my mom so she now gets Meals on Wheels while my brother is at work. A warm meal is delivered to her, and someone comes in to see that she is up and ok, 5 days a week when my brother is working. Our Case Manager also helped my mom get someone to help her with a weekly shower and light housework. She always keeps me informed of what is happening and has been so wonderful to work with. The help that my mom received from Respite Volunteers has helped improve the quality of my mom's life. But their help has also made it so my brother is able to keep his job, and I can still be at home for my kids, who are still in school and also need their own mom. The help from Respite Volunteers has helped me to be able to sleep a little better at night, knowing that my mom is okay to be in her own home where she is comfortable and happy. Thank you so much to everyone at Respite Volunteers! You have made all of our lives better.

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) & RMDs/Cash Charitable Contributions

What Is a QCD?

A **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)** allows IRA owners age **70½ or older** to donate directly from a traditional IRA to a qualified charity. When Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) apply (starting at **age 73** for those born 1951–1959), a QCD can satisfy all or part of the requirement.

Key rules:

- Counts toward your **RMD** for the year
- Must go **directly from the IRA to the charity**
- **Excluded from taxable income** (not an itemized deduction)
- Applies to **traditional IRAs only** & Annual limits are **indexed for inflation**

Must be completed by **December 31**

Why It Matters

Because QCDs reduce **Adjusted Gross Income (AGI)**, they may:

- Lower **Medicare IRMAA** surcharges
- Reduce taxation of **Social Security benefits**

Improve eligibility for other income-based tax benefits

Example: \$10,000 Gift

A 75-year-old in the **22% federal** tax bracket gives **\$10,000** from an IRA.

- **Without a QCD:** \$2,200 in federal
- **With a QCD:** \$0 tax on the gift

Result: Same charitable impact, **\$2,200 in tax savings**.

2026 Cash Charitable Contributions

If you DO NOT itemize:

Single taxpayers→ can deduct up to **\$1,000** of qualifying cash donations.

Married filing jointly → can deduct up to **\$2,000**.

This is a new deduction for **2026** & you do not have to itemize to get this deduction.

Example — married couple:

Give \$500 → \$500 deduction

Give \$2,000 → \$2,000 deduction

Give \$5,000 → \$2,000 deduction

The deduction is capped at \$2,000 if they don't itemize.

If you DO itemize

- There is **no \$1,000/\$2,000 cap**.
- Instead, beginning in 2026, charitable contributions must exceed **0.5% of AGI** before the excess is deductible.
- Example:

Married couple has \$200,000 AGI--0.5% = **\$1,000**.

They donate \$10,000 cash--First \$1,000 is below the floor.

\$9,000 potentially qualifies as a charitable deduction, subject to the other charitable-deduction rules.
